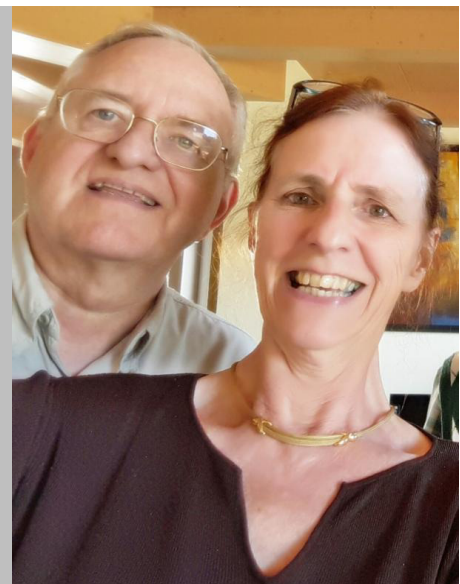
First, let me introduce you to our newly completed website, [PraxisAdvocates.com](http://PraxisAdvocates.com)

1. "The poor you will have with you always." Europe is flooded with refugees, more than ever before and in many other parts of the globe. These are often Muslims who are most open to Christ. Our strategy is to interface with Vision 5:9 and their Diaspora ministries to help the displaced refugees and immigrants who have no way back and a defeated concept of God. Traditional missionary groups, and I can name 5, are trying to stop insisting on only sharing with in-country Muslims, where results are mixed, because the world is changing toward displaced peoples. This is why I had such success in Andrew Brunson's church in Turkey, where displaced Iranians were searching for a catalyst to persevere and I was one of the keys to propelling, by the grace of God, that church into powerful expansion and multiplication. Interns needed.

2. We are beginning to see ourselves as guardians of parts of the Mediterranean where a strong Kansas City ministry has set up prayer and evangelism centers in strategic places as enclaves which will welcome the soon coming of Christ. We are invited to help strategize and to "over shepherd" some of these enclaves. They are, of course, flooded with diaspora peoples who are Muslim and reside now in Europe. We are meeting to help assist these groups as Regional Strategic Coordinators. Are you beginning to see the expanse of the European element of the diaspora strategy outside of trying to get a 6 or 3-month visa, or 12 day visa for Algeria, when these people groups are massing in Europe?

3. End of February I will continue to serve as part of the Steering Committee in Malta to assist some 800 North African Muslims and Missions leaders from those areas. My meetings will include the Mediterranean enclave ministries, the Diaspora 5:9 (from Rev 5:9) leaders, and partner with Regional Strategic Coordinators who not only minister in Muslim countries, but also in European countries, and interact fully with other missions and teams like we used to do in a much stronger way.

Missionaries must lose their distinctives on the fields and work together with other mission teams and even unite various ethno-linguistic Muslim groups and help Muslim converts develop a true ethno-musicality that doesn't sound like a translation from a Western '70s Bible song.

If you have eyes and ears, just see what God is doing. France has 9 million Muslims—an open door that has been looked upon as too "non-missionary" to be reached for the Lamb of God, except by some.

I'm on Skype, email and into personal visits to capitalize on inter-mission activities. Is this email too long to read? Is the goal too huge to accomplish? Can we have your strength through prayer, even for the poor that you will have with you always? And I'm writing my second book, a novel on Algeria and Muslim conversions.
